

Caddie Classifications & Job Descriptions

“HONOR” caddies will have average green reading skills (more detailed reading than that of “A” caddies) and will be very helpful with course knowledge.

“HONOR” Caddies are expected to perform the following tasks efficiently:

1. Keep pace with player
2. Tend the flag
3. Rake bunkers
4. Yardage to center of green
5. Clean Clubs
6. Locate golf balls
7. Clean Ball
8. Replace Divots.

“HONOR” Caddies will have at least two years of experience and a solid knowledge of the requirements of caddying, and be physically capable of carrying 2 bags for 18 holes of golf. In order to achieve “Honor” status you will have to have previous experience caddying at another club or been promoted from an “A” Caddie at Oak Hill.

“A” Caddie

“A” caddies will be expected to perform all the tasks of a “B” caddie with a better understanding of caddying while developing their abilities in green reading and course knowledge.

“A” caddies are expected to be able to perform the following tasks efficiently:

1. Keep pace with player
2. Tend the flag
3. Rake bunkers
4. Yardage to center of green
5. Clean Clubs
6. Locate golf balls
7. Clean Ball
8. Replace Divots

“B” Caddie

“B” Caddies will be new caddies with little or no golf knowledge who have gone through caddie training, passed written and on course tests. They also have also been on 1-2 training rounds accompanied by an “Honor”.

“B” caddies are expected to be able to perform the following tasks in a timely manner.

1. Keep pace with player
2. Tend the flag
3. Rake bunkers
4. Yardage to center of green
5. Clean Clubs
6. Locate golf balls
7. Clean Ball
8. Replace Divots.

“B” Caddies will have the ability either carry single golf bag or forecaddie for entire group. They are not asked to “Double Bag” until they are in “A” Ranking.

**During their first season as a caddie at Oak Hill; “B Caddies” can be promoted at most one(1) rank for that season
